SUNYAC Announces Award Winners in Men's and Women's Indoor Track and Field
Matt Moran Named Men's and Women's Coach of the Year

FREDONIA, N.Y. – The State University of New York Athletic Conference (SUNYAC) has announced the male and female Outstanding Outdoor Track and Field Athletes from the SUNYAC Championships, along with the Coaches of the Year.

Oneonta's **Kaitlin O'Sullivan (Syracuse Westhill)** has been named the Outstanding Female Track Athlete. Kaitlin captured the title in the 800m run, with a time of 2:19.93. She also added a silver medal finish in the 1500m run, with a time of 4:45.51.

Fredonia's **Julia Hopson (Poughkeepsie/Arlington)** was named the Outstanding Female Field Athlete. Hopson captured two titles; one in the shot put and one in the hammer throw. Her hammer throw provisionally qualified her for the NCAA Championships (46.50m). Her shot put throw was 11.75m. She also brought home a bronze medal in the Discus, throwing it 33.65m.

Brockport's **Josh Dupuis (Tupper Lake/Tupper Lake)** was named the Outstanding Male Field Athlete. Dupuis ended the Championship with a first and second place finish in the shot put and discus, respectively. His shot put distance of 16.00m provisionally qualified him for the NCAA Championships. His discus distance was 41.65m.

Buffalo State's **Willie Hordge (Buffalo/Forestbrook TX)** was named the Outstanding Male Track Athlete. Hordge captured the 100m and 200m events. His time of 10.56 in the 100m was a new SUNYAC Championship meet record, and was also good enough to automatically qualify for the NCAA Championships. His 200m time of 21.72, provisionally qualified him for the NCAA's in that event.

Cortland's **Matt Moran** was selected as the SUNYAC Men's and Women's Outdoor Track and Field Coach of the Year. As an interim Head Coach, Moran led his teams to the Outdoor Track and Indoor Track Championships. He collected Coach of the Year honors in both men's and women's indoor track as well.
